The Resource Conservation District of Tehama County (RCDTC) invites project partners, interested agencies, landowners, and members of the public to attend the Battle Creek Confluence Side Channel Project 65% Design Public Meeting to be held Thursday, July 16, 2026, from 3:00–4:30 p.m. in the RCDTC Conference Room at 202 Walnut Street, Red Bluff, CA

Funded by the California Wildlife Conservation Board under Grant Agreement No. WC-2298AH, the proposed project will reconnect and enhance historic side channel habitat along the Sacramento River near the Battle Creek confluence to improve rearing habitat and refuge for juvenile salmonids, including the federally endangered Sacramento River winter-run Chinook salmon and federally threatened Central Valley steelhead.

The meeting will present the 65% project design, provide updates from the project team, and discuss the remaining steps toward final design and future implementation. Representatives from FlowWest, Thomas Gast & Associates Environmental Consultants, California Open Lands, and the California Department of Water Resources will present the project findings at the meeting.

Meeting materials, including the 65% design plans, Basis of Design Report, and agenda, will be available before the meeting. A Microsoft Teams participation option will also be available for those unable to attend in person.
